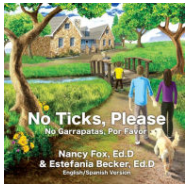


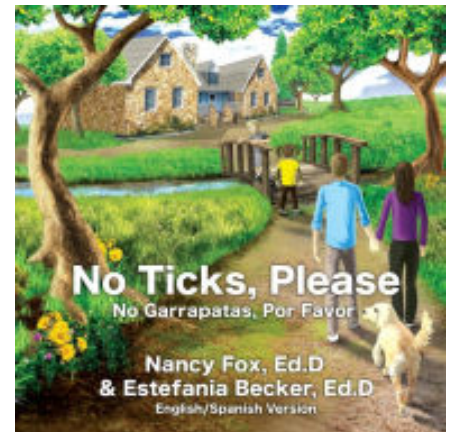
No Ticks, Please

Children ages 5-9 are at the highest risk of acquiring Lyme disease, yet there are few tools for parents and schools to use with younger children. In this book, simple messages combined with colorful, attention-getting illustrations will keep the children's interest and do provide a non-threatening platform for further discussion of how to avoid tick bites and tick-borne diseases—a must for every primary library.
