Target Audience: The target population is physicians from all specialties, nurses, psychologists, scientists, public health workers. Learning Objectives: Practitioner should be better able to identify the multiple manifestations of Lyme disease. Practitioners should be more open-minded to consider emergence of dormant infection in resurging symptoms. Practitioners should better understand that persistent pain, fatigue, and cognitive problems may be secondary to ongoing immune activation. Awareness that ticks may transmit viruses and not just bacteria. Awareness that new vaccines have been tested in animals and show promise in humans
