In the early decades of Lyme disease up until the early 2000s, it was difficult for researchers who wanted to publish in peer review to be successful due to the controversy surrounding the disease and a climate to



suppress important information on Lyme disease. The *Journal of Spirochetal & Tick-borne Diseases*, of the then LDF, published many articles germane to diagnosis, treatment, symptoms.
