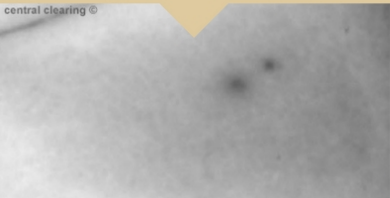
LYME DISEASE TREATMENT GUIDELINES

Clinical practice guidelines are often used as reference by physicians for Lyme disease treatment and treatment of other tick-borne diseases. The only Lyme disease treatment guidelines posted on the National Guidelines Clearinghouse (NGC), under the auspices of the US Department of Health & Human Services, are those adhering to newly revised National Academy of Medicine (NAM) standards for guidelines: the International Lyme & Associated Diseases Society (ILADS) Lyme Guidelines, which address usefulness of antibiotic prophylaxis for tick bite, effectiveness of EM treatment, and antibiotics' role in treatment of persistent Lyme disease symptoms.

The Centers for Disease Control & Prevention (CDC) has a case definition for Lyme disease which is developed by the Council of State & Territorial Epidemiologists (CSTE). This definition is meant to be used for surveillance purposes only, not for diagnosis.
